NCAC Spring Sports Update

**BASEBALL GETS UNDER WAY WITH FOUR SERIES THIS WEEKEND;
DENISON BEGINS MEN'S LACROSSE TITLE DEFENSE**

CLEVELAND -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

BASEBALL REPORT

The NCAC baseball season gets under way this weekend with four, four-game series scheduled. In the East division, Allegheny (5-4-1) hosts Kenyon (3-9) while Hiram (8-5) entertains Wooster (6-6). In the West, Denison (9-4) will travel to Ohio Wesleyan (9-4) and Wabash (10-7) will head to Wittenberg (9-3-1). Earlham (2-5-1) and Oberlin (0-0), who each play non-NCAC opponents this week, begin conference play in two weeks, April 6-7. Denison will visit the Quakers; the Yeomen will travel to Kenyon. Oberlin, on their spring trip today through March 28, had the first six games of their season postponed due to weather.

Poll: The American Baseball Association preseason poll ranked Wooster fifth, and Ohio Wesleyan 13 (out of 30). The first ABCA regular season poll will be released March 31. In their preseason poll, NCAC Coaches picked the Scots to repeat as league champions, followed by Ohio Wesleyan, Allegheny, Wittenberg and Denison in places two through five.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Hiram junior outfielder **Joe Marzano (Youngstown, OH/Cardinal Mooney)** batted .600 (6-10) in three games last week. He recorded one home run, four runs batted in and four runs scored. He is tied for the team lead with four homers and 15 RBI. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Wabash sophomore **Jon Horne (Cincinnati, OH/St. Xavier)** threw a complete game, nine inning shutout of Olivet last week. The lefty scattered two hits and struck out five batters while walking only three to move his season record to 2-3 and lowering his ERA to 3.86.

GOLF REPORT

Five North Coast teams - Denison, Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster - will compete at the Muskingum Invitational at Eaglesticks Golf Course on Friday and Saturday. The Bishops won last spring's 12-team event. Also next week, Allegheny travels to the Malone Invitational on Friday and Saturday, while Hiram will play in the Westminster Invitational on Sunday. Ohio Wesleyan finished fourth at the Golden Isles Collegiate Invitational, held on Jekyll Island, Ga. last week. Thirteen of the 19 teams in the field, including the Bishops were ranked. Ohio Wesleyan is seventh in the current GCAA Precept Coaches' Poll (Mar. 12). Junior **Chad Poling (Delaware/Hayes)** led the Bishops during the third and final day of competition. He finished in a fifth-place tie at 219 after shooting his third consecutive round of 73. Senior **Jeremy Meade (Wayland, Mass.)** tied for 15th place at 224.

MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

Two conference contests are on tap this week - both are set for Saturday. Defending champion Denison (1-0, 1-4) visits Ohio Wesleyan (0-0, 3-1) and Wooster (0-1, 2-2) travels to Kenyon (1-0, 3-1). Last spring, the Big Red rolled to a perfect 5-0 record and are looking to repeat their feat. The Bishops finished 4-1, their only loss coming at the hands of Denison. Every North Coast Athletic Conference men's lacrosse title has been won or shared by either the Big Red or the Bishops. Kenyon snuck in for a share of the crown in 2000 as the only other school to claim a piece of a league championship. In their preseason poll, NCAC Coaches unanimously picked Ohio Wesleyan to finish first, followed by Denison and Kenyon in second and third.

Denison and Kenyon share the early lead in the conference race: Each have won their conference openers. Ohio Wesleyan and Wittenberg are the only teams not to see conference action yet this season. OWU opens this week; the Tigers face Oberlin on April 5.

Poll: In the latest USILA national poll (Mar. 17), Ohio Wesleyan is ranked 12th (of 20).

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ohio Wesleyan senior **Andy Rowe (Alpharetta, GA/Penfield, NY)** tallied six points on five goals and one assist in the Bishops' victory over Cabrini. He is the second-leading goal scorer in the league averaging 3.50 goals per game with 14 goals in four games.

WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT

The North Coast Athletic Conference schedule opens this week with three contests on tap. Last year's runner-up, Denison (3-2), opens at Earlham (1-1). Ohio Wesleyan (3-2) will visit Wittenberg (0-3) on Wednesday. Allegheny (0-2) travels to Kenyon (1-1) on Saturday to round out the week's league slate. Defending champion Wooster (1-1) begins its conference campaign on April 2 at Oberlin (0-0). The Big Red have won 14 of the previous 18 NCAC titles. Oberlin claimed the three that Denison and Wooster did not - their last was in 1998.

Eight players scored at least one goal for Denison in an 18-4 win over Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Senior **Katie Keating (Englewood, CO/Cherry Creek)** scored five goals to lead the Big Red. Ohio Wesleyan senior midfielder **Amanda McDermott (Wayne, PA/Episcopal Academy)** led the Bishops to a 20-0 win over Medaille with four goals and two assists. On March 14, she scored the 100th goal of her career in a 9-8 win over Redlands. She also added a second goal in the game.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Earlham sophomore **Brooke Sachs (Houston, TX/Bellaire)** recorded a hat trick, scoring three goals and also recording three assists as the Quakers won their first game of the season, a 10-7 win over Medaille. The win was Earlham's first home victory in lacrosse since 1996. Sachs was instrumental in the Quaker win as Earlham outscored Medaille 7-3 in the second-half after trailing 4-3 at halftime.

SOFTBALL REPORT

The bulk of the sixth NCAC season gets underway on Wednesday, April 2. Wooster (6-8) will travel to Allegheny (1-8), while Hiram (2-10) and Wittenberg (5-7) will head to Kenyon (5-7) and Ohio Wesleyan (6-7), respectively. The 2003 campaign opened last week, when the Kenyon Ladies swept both games of a doubleheader against Oberlin (2-2). Kenyon shut out the Yeowomen, 2-0, in the opener of the twinbill and won 7-1 in the second game. Denison (6-8) is the defending champion, having won the title the past two seasons in a row; Wittenberg won the previous season. Allegheny won the first two crowns. In their preseason poll, NCAC Coaches picked both the Big Red and the Gators to finish first, followed by Wooster, Ohio Wesleyan and Wittenberg in places three through five.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Kenyon sophomore shortstop/catcher **Dana Halicki (North Royalton, OH/Padua Franciscan)** went 7-for-12 (.583) to score three runs and raise her average to a team-best .390. Halicki also leads the Ladies in hits (16) and runs scored (8). **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Ohio Wesleyan senior righthander **Emily Thornton (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** went 2-0 for the Bishops last week. She pitched a four-hit shutout against Mt. St. Joseph, striking out eight batters and walking three. She then threw a complete game in a win over Thomas More, allowing seven hits and two earned runs while fanning five batters and walking two.

MEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Three NCAC matches are scheduled this week. In the East, Allegheny (0-0, 4-7) opens its divisional schedule at Hiram (0-1, 3-2) on Wednesday. In the West, Ohio Wesleyan (0-1, 3-4) travels to Denison (0-0, 1-4) on Wednesday. The Big Red then travel to Earlham (0-0, 10-0) on Thursday. Wittenberg (1-0, 5-3), the early leader in the West, heads to Wabash (0-0, 0-4) on Saturday. Oberlin (1-0, 4-4) is the early leader in the East.

Wittenberg placed second at Wabash's Kerry Seward Invitational, followed by Ohio Wesleyan in fourth and Wabash in eighth at the eight-team invitational. The Tigers claimed three second-place finishes in individual flights and picked up three more in the doubles. Individual finishers: **Casey Clagett (Steamboat Springs, CO/Steamboat Springs)** - number 1 singles, **Eric Cusick (Lima, OH/Senior)** - no. 3 singles, **Mike Herzog (Springfield, OH/Northwestern)** - no. 4 singles. Clagett/Herzog finished second at no. 1 doubles, while Cusick partnered with **Duby Lakos (Lynchburg, VA/Heritage)** at no. 3 doubles. The tandem of **Ben Hodgkiss-Lilly (Cleveland Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)** and **Shane Hutton (Charleston, WV/Charleston Catholic)** finished second at no. 2 doubles.

WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT

Five conference matches are scheduled for the coming week, three of them involve Allegheny (0-0, 5-6). The Gators host Hiram (0-1, 0-3) on Tuesday and defending champion Denison (1-0, 4-1) and Ohio Wesleyan (1-1, 2-2) on Saturday. The Bishops stay home earlier in the week; the Bishops face Wooster (0-0, 0-2) on Tuesday. The final league match of the week send Wittenberg (0-0, 2-5) to Wooster on Saturday. Kenyon, last spring's runner-up, opens its NCAC season on April 7 at home against Ohio Wesleyan. The Ladies have taken 15 of 18 North Coast titles. Denison (2002 and 1994) and Allegheny (1984) are the only other schools to have claimed conference championships in women's tennis.

Denison and Oberlin (1-0, 6-1) each won their conference openers and share the early lead. Oberlin senior **Alaina Fotiu-Wojotowicz (Okemos, MI/Okemos)** has the top record at both number-one singles (6-1 overall) and first doubles (6-1), where she competes with sophomore **Ary Amerikaner (Huntington, WV/Huntington)**.

TRACK & FIELD REPORT

In the coming week, all 10 schools will compete in outdoor track and field. Allegheny, Denison, Kenyon Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster will be at the Wooster Invitational, Earlham will be at the Hanover Invitational, Hiram run at the Battleground Relays in Fredericksburg, VA, Oberlin will compete in the Raleigh (NC) Relays, Wabash travels to Indianapolis for the Gerald England Invitational, and Wittenberg visits Rhodes for the Bigcat classic.

The first week of outdoor track season saw 2003 NCAC Men's Indoor Track champion Allegheny win the Point Loma Nazarene Invitational. Senior **Dan Princic (Carrolton, OH/Carrolton)** led the way with a victory in the 1500 meters (3:57.62) and a runner-up finish in the 800 meters (1:59.36). Other individual winners for the Gators were **Devon Halley (Cranberry Twp., PA/Seneca Valley)** in the 3000-meter steeplechase (9:53.0) and **Sean Laird (Monroeville, PA/Gateway)** in the long jump (5.85 meters/19 feet, 2.5 inches). The Gator women placed second of five teams at the same event. They claimed five event titles: **Maureen Copeland (Mt. Pleasant, PA/Geibel Catholic)** in the 5K (19:08.07), **Ali Foote (Groveland, MA/Pentucket Regional)** in the 400-meter hurdles (1:13.17), **Lindsey Hayes (Little Silver, NJ/Red Bank Regional)** in the 800 meters (2:19.68), **Beth Singer (Waterford, PA/General McLane)** in the javelin (35.42 meters/116 feet, 2 inches) and **Chelsea Benson (Mt. Jewett, PA/Kane)** in the 3000-meter steeplechase (11:49.2) ... Kenyon competed in the UNC-Charlotte Track and Field Classic. **Ben Hildebrand (Fairport, NY/The Harley School)** and **Michael Baird (Temple, TX/Temple)** each had two top-four finishes. Hildebrand was second in the steeplechase (9:28.28) and third in the 5K (15:02.93), while Baird was right behind him in both events, placing third in the steeplechase (9:28.32) and fourth in the 5K (15:05.52). **Christina McNamara (Chappaqua, NY/Horace Greeley)** led the women as the team's top finisher in the 1500 meters (4:50.88) and she placed 17th of 55 runners, and was 29th of 70 in the 800 meters with a 2:26.32 clocking ... Ohio Wesleyan's men placed 16th in the 18-team Emory Invitational. Sophomore **Randy Everett (Dalton, OH/Dalton)** recorded the Bishops' top individual finish when he placed fourth in the high jump with a leap of 6 feet, 3/4 inches. The women tied for 13th among 19 teams at the meet. Junior **Fay Barry (Reynoldsburg, OH/Reynoldsburg)** was the top individual with a third-place showing in the discus with a throw of 129 feet, 5 inches. She was also eighth in the javelin (97-6) and 11th in the shot put ... Wabash hosted the 49th annual Wabash Relays, a non-scoring meet. The Little Giants were named the Outstanding Team based on the number of first-place finishes. Three athletes won individual events. They were junior **Dan Ruge (Chesterton, IN/Chesterton)** in the 5K (16:14.40), senior **Caleb Ishman (Gary, IN/Emerson Visual and Performing Arts)** in the hammer (47.15 meters/154 feet, 8 1/2 inches) and senior **Adam Futscher (Cincinnati, OH/Sycamore)** in the javelin (47.09 meters/154 feet, 5 1/2 inches) ... At the non-scoring Muskingum Invitational, **Kristen Mumper (Cincinnati, OH/Purcell Marian)** led Wittenberg women with first-place finishes in both the long jump and the high jump. **Skip Ivery (Columbus, OH/Groveport-Madison)** won the 110-meter hurdles and **Joe Rumschlag (Maumee, OH/Toledo Christian)** took the high jump .. Wooster competed at the non-scoring Florida State Invitational and Florida State Relays. Freshman **Jill Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** broke the outdoor school mark in the women's pole vault when she cleared 10 feet even.

MEN'S MIDDLE DISTANCE/DISTANCE: Kenyon senior **Ben Hildebrand (Fairport, NY/The Harley School)** led the Lords at the UNC-Charlotte Track and Field Classic. He placed second in the steeplechase (9:28.32) and was third in the 5K (15:02.93).

MEN'S SPRINTS/HURDLES: Wittenberg sophomore **Jason Toman (Greenville, OH/Greenville)** set a personal best in the 400-meter hurdles (58.03) as he placed third in the event at the Muskingum Invitational.

MEN'S FIELD: Wittenberg sophomore **Clyde Mayer (Hilliard, OH/Davidson)** recorded a personal best in the discus (146 feet, 3 inches) to place third in the discus at the Muskingum Invitational. He also placed eighth in the shot put (44 feet even).

WOMEN'S MIDDLE DISTANCE/DISTANCE: Ohio Wesleyan junior **Liz Tullberg (Chevy Chase, MD/Bethesda Chevy Chase)** placed seventh among a field of 38 runners in the 1500 meters at the Emory Invitational. She was timed at 5:08.74.

WOMEN'S SPRINTS/HURDLES: Wittenberg junior **Kristen Mumper (Cincinnati, OH/Purcell Marian)** won the 400 meters (60.94) and was part of the fifth-place 4x100 meter relay that crossed the line in 52.91 at the Muskingum Invitational.

WOMEN'S FIELD: Denison junior **Laura Finkes (Lakewood, OH/Lakewood)** won the discus and met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard in the event at the Muskingum Invitational. Her throw was 142 feet, 6 inches.
