### NCAC Spring Sports Update

**SOFTBALL SEASON IN FULL SWING;**

**WOOSTER BEGINS WOMEN'S LACROSSE TITLE DEFENSE**

**For Immediate Release**

**March 31, 2003**

**CLEVELAND** -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

#### **BASEBALL REPORT**

Allegheny (2-0, 7-6-1) and Wooster (2-0, 8-7) are off to fast starts and lead the East Division through an abbreviated first weekend of conference action. The Gators host Hiram (0-2, 9-7) in divisional play this weekend. Allegheny took two games from visiting Kenyon (0-2, 5-11) last week. The remaining two games of the series were postponed due to weather conditions and will be made up later in the season. No date has been announced. The Fighting Scots take a break from divisional play this week. Instead, Wooster welcomes Wittenberg (1-3, 10-6-1) in non-divisional action on Saturday. The Scots also managed to play two of four league games last week, winning twice at Hiram. The remaining two games in the series will be made up on April 22 at Hiram. In other divisional action, Oberlin (0-0, 3-4) begins league play at Kenyon on Saturday and Sunday.

The weather was more cooperative in the West Division, as both of last week's NCAC series were completed. Ohio Wesleyan (3-1, 12-5) and Wabash (3-1, 13-8) each won three of four contests to grab a share of first place. The tie should be short-lived as the two teams square off in Crawfordsville this weekend. Against Denison last week, the Bishops won twice on Saturday before dropping a game to the Big Red on Sunday. Ohio Wesleyan then won the final game of the series. Wabash took three straight games from Wittenberg, before the Tigers triumphed in the fourth. Denison will look to rebound when the Big Red travel to Earlham this weekend. The series will be the first NCAC competition of the season for the Quakers.

**Poll:** The first ABCA poll of the season (Mar. 31) ranks Ohio Wesleyan 12th. The Bishops are ranked second in the Mideast Region, behind Marietta. (11-5).

#### **GOLF REPORT**

Every NCAC team but Ohio Wesleyan will compete this Friday and Saturday in the Kenyon Cup at the Apple Valley Golf Course. The team title is up for grabs as the Bishops are the defending champions.

Last week, Ohio Wesleyan won the Muskingum Invitational for the third straight year, this time with a two-round score of 590. The Bishops shot a searing six over par 286 on the second day to overtake Denison, which led by 14 strokes after the first day. The Big Red wound up second with a 593, followed by Wittenberg in sixth (626), Wooster tied for seventh (638) and Kenyon in 12th (662). Sophomore **Craig Eckerle (Indianapolis, IN/Pike)** of Denison was the individual medalist after he carded a four over par 71-73=144. In other action, Allegheny finished fifth in the 15-team Malone College Invitational. The Gators shot 304 as a team in the event that was shortened to one day by the weather. Junior **Dave Lester (Grove City, OH/Grove City)** was the top individual with a 74. Wabash placed third in the six-team Hanover Invitational. Freshman **Elliot Vice (Ladoga, IN/Southmont)** fired a two-round 153 to take fourth as the Little Giants' top individual.

#### **MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT**

Three conference contests are on tap this week. On Saturday, the two teams that enter the week tied for first place – Kenyon (1-0, 4-2) and Ohio Wesleyan (1-0, 4-1) - square off in Delaware. The same day, Oberlin hosts Wittenberg (0-0, 2-2) in the Tigers' conference opener. The other NCAC contest takes place on Wednesday, when Wooster (0-1, 2-3) travels to Oberlin (0-2, 1-4).

In the only NCAC contest last week, Ohio Wesleyan knocked off defending champion Denison (1-1, 1-5), 13-8. Senior **Frank Bedford (Villanova, PA/Radnor)** scored six goals and added an assist for the Bishops, while senior **Greg Mavraganis (Lancaster, PA/Hempfield)** led the Big Red with three goals. Kenyon defeated Wooster in non-conference action. Junior **Ross**

**Zachary (Scarsdale, NY/Scarsdale)** had four goals and four assists for the Lords. Wittenberg won twice last week. Freshman **Andy Joly (St. Louis, MO/DeSmet Jesuit)** scored three times in the Tigers' 11-4 defeat of Washington & Jefferson.

Bishop sophomore **John Schlegel (Chevy Chase, MD/Gonzaga)** leads the NCAC in scoring (5.20 point per game) and shares the conference lead in goals with teammate Bedford (3.60 goals per game). Kenyon sophomore **Dave Neiman (Glencoe, IL/New Trier)** leads all NCAC goalkeepers with a .640 saves percentage.

**Poll:** In the latest USILA national poll (Mar. 31), Ohio Wesleyan is ranked 14th.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT**

Every squad but Denison will see NCAC play this week. Wednesday, Ohio Wesleyan (1-0, 4-3) and Kenyon (1-0, 2-1), two teams that share the early lead, face off in Gambier. Wooster (0-0/2-1), the defending NCAC champion, begins its title defense the same day when the Scots travel to Oberlin's (0-0, 0-3) home field. Saturday, Earlham (0-0, 1-1) opens its conference season by hosting Allegheny (0-1, 1-4). The Gators lost their opener last week to Kenyon. The final conference matchup on tap pits Wittenberg (0-1, 0-4) against the Yeowomen in Oberlin.

Last week, Allegheny freshman **Emily Deering (Hollis, ME/Hollis)** scored 12 goals and one assist as the Gators went 1-2. She has at least one goal in all five of her team's games .. Denison scored 10 unanswered goals in the second half to blow open a game that they led by three at the half against Montclair State. Senior **Leslie Masterpaul (Cleveland Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)** scored five times and added an assist to lead the Big Red ... Kenyon senior **Melissa Blum (Chevy Chase, MD/St. Andrew's)** scored three goals and assisted on another in the Ladies 12-6 defeat of Allegheny ... Ohio Wesleyan senior **Amanda McDermott (Wayne, PA/Episcopal Academy)** scored five goals in a 13-10 victory over Wittenberg, then added three more in a 18-14 win over Alfred. Teammate **Carrie Williams (Hingham, MA/Hingham)** had nine goals and three assists on the week and she now leads the NCAC with 5.29 points per game ... Wittenberg senior **Cara Romanowski (Collegeville, PA/Perkiomen Valley)**, who leads the league with 4.25 goals per game, scored five times to lead the Tigers against the Bishops. It was her second, five-goal game of the year ... Wooster's **Beth Hemminger (Annapolis, MD/Senior)** notched the first three goals of the game, and scored on all five of the shots she took to lead the Scots to a 16-6 decision over Indiana (Pa.).

**SOFTBALL REPORT**

The 2003 North Coast season kicks off in earnest Wednesday with three doubleheaders. Allegheny (2-9) hosts Wooster (7-11) and Kenyon (2-0, 6-10) and Ohio Wesleyan (9-10) welcome Hiram (4-12) and Wittenberg (8-10), respectively. Kenyon retains the early lead in the conference race. Wooster leads the NCAC in pitching with a collective 1.58 ERA. Junior **Angie Barone (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)** leads the league with 65 strikeouts in 46.2 innings of work. Her sister, **Natalie (Akron, OH/St. Thomas Aquinas)**, a freshman, is third in the conference with an ERA of 1.02. Last week, she allowed only two earned runs in 14.0 innings pitched. Wittenberg leads the conference in team batting (141-463, .305).

**MEN'S TENNIS REPORT**

There are two conference divisional matches scheduled for the coming week, both involving East Division teams. Hiram (0-2, 3-4) travels to Kenyon (0-0, 6-3) on Thursday, while Allegheny (1-0, 5-9) heads over to Wooster (0-0, 4-4) on Saturday. Last week, the Gators defeated Hiram, 7-0. Allegheny Head Coach **Mark Fleming** recorded his 500th career win as the Gator men, and women, topped the Terriers. Oberlin (1-0, 8-7) and Allegheny are tied for first in the East.

No divisional matches are scheduled in the West this week. That means Wittenberg (2-0, 6-3) and Denison (2-0, 4-4) will each continue to share the top spot in the standings for at least one more week. Last week, the Big Red swept both Ohio Wesleyan (0-2, 5-6) and Earlham (0-1, 11-1). Senior **Danny Klein (Shaker Hts., OH)** picked up three victories at second singles to elevate his overall record to 7-1. He leads the NCAC at that flight.

There will be four crossover, nonconference matches this week. On Tuesday, Wittenberg travels to Wooster. Then on Saturday, Earlham and Wabash (0-1, 2-8) head over to Hiram and Oberlin, respectively. Ohio Wesleyan ends the week at Kenyon, also on Saturday.

**WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT**

There are only two conference matches scheduled this week. On Tuesday, Ohio Wesleyan (2-1, 3-2) hosts Oberlin (1-0, 9-4) and on Saturday, Hiram (0-2, 0-0) welcomes Earlham (0-1, 5-4). In nonconference play, Denison (2-0, 5-1), Kenyon (0-0, 3-3), Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan and Wooster (0-2, 0-5) will all participate in the Great Lakes Colleges Association tournament on Friday and Saturday.

Last week, Allegheny (1-1, 6-7) defeated Hiram and lost to Denison. Ohio Wesleyan and Wittenberg (1-0, 3-5) each topped Wooster. Denison's number three doubles team of **Meredith Sulser (Dublin, OH/Coffman)** and **Sara Mandzak (Franklin, OH/Lebanon)** improved to a 6-0 record with their win at Allegheny. They lead the conference at their flight. Sulser also leads the league at number one singles, with a 5-1 record.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT**

Coming up this week, Allegheny participates in the Duke Invitational on Friday and Saturday. Denison is at Wilmington, Earlham runs at the Anderson Invitational, and Hiram and Oberlin travel to Case Western Reserve for the Bill Sudeck Invitational. Kenyon and Wooster are at Otterbein's invitational, Ohio Wesleyan joins Wittenberg for the Tigers' Wittenberg Classic, and Wabash competes at the Manchester Invitational.

Last week, five schools participated in the Wooster Invitational. The Scots were the top team finisher on the men's side in sixth place. Allegheny was eighth, followed by Ohio Wesleyan in ninth, Denison in 12th and Kenyon, 13th. Leading the women was Denison, which tied for second. Wooster was sixth, the Bishops, seventh, and Allegheny and Kenyon were ninth and 11th, respectively. Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Justin Blackburn (Wadsworth, OH/Wadsworth)** won the men's 110-meter hurdles (15.62), and teammate **Nate Efinger (Andover, MA/Gov. Dummer Academy)** took the long jump (20-9). Wooster sophomore **Nii Djan Tackie (Accra, Ghana/St. Thomas Aquinas)** won the men's triple jump (42-2 1/4). Denison junior **Jackie Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** was a double winner in the women's competition. She claimed first place in the 100 meters (12.44) and 200 meters (25.65). Her teammate, **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** was also a double winner, taking both the shot put (42-2 1/4) and discus (138-2). Finkes met the NCAA provisional qualifying standard in both events. Ohio Wesleyan sophomore **Jen Musbach (North Olmsted/North Olmsted)** in the triple jump (29-10) and Allegheny senior **Tiffany Bennett (Russell, PA/Eisenhower)** in the javelin (120-5) were the other individual winners from NCAC schools ... Hiram senior **Emma Brown (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** won the long jump (16-4 1/2) and was second in the high jump (5-0) to lead the Terriers at the Battleground Relays, hosted by Mary Washington. Junior **Scott Cothren (Fredericktown, OH/Fredericktown)** was the top individual finisher for the men as he was runner-up in the high jump (6-0) ... Earlham sophomore **Tashi Johnson (Bloomington, IN/South)** won the 100 meters (12.2) and 200 meters (25.6) and was part of the Quakers' winning 4x100 meter relay (51.8). All three times were school records ... Wabash placed sixth of 20 teams at the University of Indianapolis Invitational. Sophomore **Zach Eichel (Columbus, IN/North)** led the Little Giants with a second-place finish in the 10K (34:07.48) ... Wittenberg had a pair of first-place finishers in the Rhodes/Memphis Big Cat Classic. Sophomore **Joe Rumschlag (Maumee, OH/Toledo Christian)** won the men's long jump with a leap of 22 feet, 1/2 inch, a personal best. He also placed fifth in the triple jump (42-4 1/4). Junior **Joel Drake (Springfield, OH/Shawnee)** won the shot put with a toss of 47 feet, 9 inches.

**WOOSTER'S NELSON SELECTED NABC DIVISION III PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

The National Association of Basketball Coaches announced **Bryan Nelson (Kettering, OH/Kettering Fairmont)** will be the recipient of its NCAA Division III Player-of-the-Year award for the 2002-03 season. Nelson, a senior post player at Wooster, averaged 20.8 points and 8.6 rebounds in leading the Scots to a 30-3 season and their first trip to the Div. III "Final Four."

Nelson will be honored, along with the Div. I and Div. II Players of the Year, Sunday, April 6, at the annual NABC Awards Show, which will be held at the Hilton Riverside in New Orleans, La., in conjunction with the Div. I "Final Four" weekend.

The 6-4, 230-pound forward also was selected the NABC Great Lakes District Player of the Year, which automatically includes his listing on the coaches organization's All-America First Team, and the NCAC Player of the Year for his efforts this season.

Nelson's scoring average in 2002-03 was the most by a Wooster player since 1970-71. His .644 field-goal percentage (221-of-343) and .885 free throw percentage (193-of-218), made him the league leader in both categories - first to do so in NCAC history - and put him as the only player in the top-20 in the nation in each category. Nelson's season also will go down in the Scot record books as the second-most for total points (645), fifth-highest scoring average, third-most field goals made (221), and third-highest field-goal percentage, as well as rank him No. 1 in free throws made (193), and fourth in free throw percentage. Other statistical notes of interest include Nelson leading the team in scoring 22 times and in rebounding in 24 of his 29 games played. He also totaled 59 assists, 37 steals, and 10 blocked shots.

Nelson was tagged with sectional MVP honors after combining for 45 points and 29 rebounds in the "Sweet 16" and "Elite Eight" victories, and followed that up by going for 29 points in both the national semifinal and consolation games while playing with a severe injury to earn All-"Final Four" Team mention.

Nelson joins "W" Association Hall-of-Famer **Ian Banda**, a men's soccer player from 1987-90, as the only two athletes in Wooster history to earn a national Player-of-the-Year award. Banda was the Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America's choice for the NCAA Div. III Player of the Year in 1990.

## NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (MAR. 31)

### BASEBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Earlham senior first-baseman **Sean O'Reilly (Indianapolis, IN/Bishop Chatard)** went 12-22 from the plate with 10 RBI's and two home runs including Earlham's first of the season in an 8-7 win over Mount St. Joseph. O'Reilly helped the Quakers to a 3-3 week batting .545, also garnering four doubles and two walks. He also stole two bases. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Allegheny pitcher **Josh Sharpless (Freedom, PA/Freedom)** had a 2.25 ERA last week, striking out 16 and walking just four in 12.0 innings of work. The senior had a complete-game, three-hit effort against Kenyon for the win while striking out nine. Against Penn St.-Behrend, he had seven strikeouts in five scheduled innings of work.

### MEN'S LACROSSE

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Ohio Wesleyan senior **Frank Bedford (Villanova, PA/Radnor)** scored six goals and added an assist as the Bishops knocked off defending champion Denison, 13-8.

### WOMEN'S LACROSSE

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Allegheny freshman **Emily Deering (Hollis, ME/Hollis)** scored 12 goals and one assist for 13 points as the Gators went 1-2 last week. She had four goals in a 9-8 win over Buffalo State, four more in an 8-6 loss to Fredonia State and four goals and an assist in a 12-6 loss to Kenyon. She has a least one goal in all five of Allegheny's games this season.

### SOFTBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Wittenberg senior **Beth Walters (Westerville, OH/Columbus DeSales)** went 10-16 (.625) last week with six runs and four runs batted in. Serving as the team's cleanup hitter, Walters is hitting .400 (20-50) for the season and leads the Tigers in hits (20), runs (12), RBI (11) and total bases (24). **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Allegheny junior **Tracie Gaydos (Sarvar, PA/Freepport)** had a complete-game, three-hit shutout of Mt. Union to pick up a win in the opening game of a twinbill and then threw four innings of relief in the Gators' loss. She allowed one earned run in 11.0 innings of work for a 0.64 ERA. She struck out four and gave up seven hits.

### MEN'S AND WOMEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK - DISTANCE/MIDDLE DISTANCE RUNNER

**MEN'S:** Wabash sophomore **Zack Eichel (Columbus, IN/North)** placed second in the 10,000 meters at the Indianapolis Invitational with a time of 34:07. **WOMEN'S:** Wittenberg junior **Becky Barnes (Williamsport, OH/Westfall)** placed third in the 5,000 meters with a personal best time of 19:06.49 at the Memphis Big Cat Invitational. She also had a personal-best in the 1500 meters (5:05.32), which gave her seventh place.

### MEN'S AND WOMEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK - SPRINTS/HURDLES

**MEN'S:** Earlham freshman **Greg Stanley (Marion, IN/Marion)** won the 100 meters (11.1) and 200 meters (22.5) and was part of the Quakers' winning 4x100 meter relay team that set a school record (42.5) at the Hanover Invitational. **WOMEN'S:** Earlham sophomore **Tashi Johnson (Bloomington, IN/South)** won the 100 meters (12.2) and 200 meters (25.6) and was part of the Quakers' winning 4x100 meter relay (51.8). All three times were school records.

### MEN'S AND WOMEN'S OUTDOOR TRACK - FIELD

**MEN'S:** Wittenberg sophomore **Joe Rumschlag (Maumee, OH/Toledo Christian)** won the long jump at the Memphis Big Cat Classic with a leap of 22 feet, 1/2 inch, a personal best. He also placed fifth in the triple jump (42-4 1/4). **WOMEN'S:** Wooster freshman **Jill Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** placed second in the pole vault at the Wooster Invitational. Her vault of 10 feet even was a new school mark.
