**NCAC Spring Sports Update**

**WITTENBERG AND DENISON SHARE SOFTBALL LEAD;  
SIX MEN'S TENNIS TEAMS TO COMPETE AT GLCA TOURNEY**

**CLEVELAND** -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's spring sports action.

**BASEBALL REPORT**

Wooster (2-0, 12-7), which did not play any conference competition last week remains the only NCAC team, in either division, with a perfect divisional record. The Scots resume conference play this week when they host third-place Oberlin (2-2, 6-6). Kenyon (2-4, 8-13) heads to Hiram (1-5, 10-12) in this week's other Eastern matchup. The Lords and Yeomen both picked up their first two NCAC wins of the season, after splitting their series last week. Second-place Allegheny (5-1, 12-7-1), which has no divisional play slated for this week, took three of four from the Terriers. Wooster topped Wittenberg twice in non-conference action.

After two weekends of divisional play, three teams share identical records in the West. Denison (5-3, 15-8), Ohio Wesleyan (5-3, 14-8) and Wabash (5-3, 15-10) all share first place with five wins and three losses. The standings may change after this weekend, however. While Ohio Wesleyan does not have any divisional games slated, Wabash travels to Denison. The other Western matchup sends Earlham (0-4, 6-12-1) to Wittenberg (1-3, 12-9-1). Last week, the Big Red swept the Quakers, while the Battling Bishops and Little Giants split.

**Notes:** Allegheny junior infielder **Brendon Porter (Pittsburgh, PA/Franklin Regional)** went 9-18 (.500) and drove in 12 runs in six games last week, leading the Gators to a 5-1 record. In four conference games against Hiram, he went 7-10 (.700), had seven runs batted in, and scored five runs. He picked up four RBI in a win over Point Park as well. Senior **Jesse MacPherson (Hemlock, NY/Livonia)** threw a complete-game shutout against the Terriers to improve to 3-1 on the season. He allowed only six hits in his first shutout of the season. For the year, he has a 1.74 ERA ... Denison junior **Brian Regan (Cincinnati, OH/Anderson)** hit .350 (7-20) in five games this week, with nine runs scored and five RBI. He moved into second place on the Big Red single-season home run list with his eighth round tripper of the season. Regan was 4-4 in steal attempts. He leads the NCAC with 12 stolen bases on 13 attempts this season ... Earlham senior catcher **Adam Fowler (Dayton, OH/Carroll)** led the Quakers at the plate going 7-12 (.583) with four RBI. He scored three runs, earned 10 total bases and struck out only once in five games ... Hiram senior centerfielder **Mike Diamond (Westlake, OH/Westlake)** is riding an eight-game hitting streak after hitting safely in all six of the Terriers' games last week. He was 7-17 (.412) for the week ... Oberlin senior **Zach Pretzer (Vermilion, OH)** became the Yeomen's all-time leader in hits after going 4-16 against Kenyon last week. Sophomore **Kyle Neumeier (Ranch Palos Verdes, CA)** was 10-17 (.588) for the week with five doubles, nine runs and eight RBI ... Wabash junior outfielder **Mike Mack (Butler, IN/Eastside)** went 6-12 (.500) with four runs scored and three RBI against Ohio Wesleyan. Mack had a two-run double in Saturday's 5-1 victory by the Little Giants, their first against OWU in school history to end an 0-15 drought against the Bishops. Mack had a walk and a sacrifice fly, and was perfect in the field with 11 putouts. Sophomore lefty **Bill Goff (Brownsburg, IN/Brownsburg)** threw a complete game in the win, scattering seven hits, allowing only one earned run and one walk while striking out four in seven innings. He improved to 3-1 for the season ... Wittenberg sophomore **Matt Foster (Granville, OH/Granville)** was 10-21 (.476), scoring six runs. He had four RBI and one homer ... Wooster junior **Mark Parrish (Elyria, OH/Elyria)** hurled 8.0 innings last week. He got the win with four scoreless innings of one-hit relief against Mt. Vernon Nazarene, while striking out a pair. Then, Parrish started his first career game against Kent State, and allowed two runs on just one hit with one strikeout over the first four innings. Wooster has now beaten three-straight NCAA Div. I opponents. The others were Ohio State in 2002 (9-7) and Akron in 2001 (8-4). The Scots face Ohio State on April 16. Other NCAC teams which schedule Div. I opponents: Ohio Wesleyan at Ohio University this weekend and Wittenberg at Dayton on Tuesday.

**GOLF REPORT**

Denison, Kenyon, Ohio Wesleyan, Wittenberg and Wooster will all compete at the Big Red Spring Classic Invitational at Granville Golf Course on Saturday and Sunday. Ohio Wesleyan won last year's event. Hiram is also hosting an Invitational on Saturday. Oberlin is the only other NCAC team that will compete in the event. Wabash will head to the Illinois Wesleyan Invitational on Friday and Saturday, while Allegheny will compete at the Mid-Atlantic Regional on Sunday and Monday. The Gators begin the week at Slippery Rock on Tuesday and at Indiana University (Pa.) on Wednesday.

Last week, Wooster finished second at the Kenyon Cup Invitational. Four Scot golfers shot under 80 on day two of the tournament to lift the Scots into second place at the 15-team event (331-306=637) - their highest showing at a spring tournament since 1998, when they were the runner-ups at the NCAC Championship. Allegheny followed in third (638), Denison tied for fourth (641). Wittenberg (658) was seventh, while Wabash cut 10 strokes from its first day score to finish 10th (346-336=682). The host Lords were 12th (686) and Oberlin was 14th (720). Allegheny sophomore **Ben Rathfon (Clarion, PA/North Clarion County)** earned medalist honors, shooting 74-71=145 to win by five strokes. He finished one over par on the par 72 course.

**Poll:** The latest GCAA Precept Division III Coaches' Poll (Mar. 26) ranks Ohio Wesleyan sixth. Allegheny is tabbed 21st and Denison is 25th. Wooster also received votes.

**MEN'S LACROSSE REPORT**

Three conference contests are on tap again this week. Preseason favorite and current leader Ohio Wesleyan (2-0, 5-1) travels to Wooster (1-1, 4-3) Tuesday, then visits Denison (2-1, 3-5) on Saturday for a non-conference contest. The Bishops defeated the Big Red, 13-8, in their NCAC meeting on March 29. Wednesday, Kenyon (1-1, 4-3) and Wittenberg (1-1, 4-3), tied in the standings with the Scots, duke it out. The Tigers then travel to take on Wooster on Saturday. Oberlin (0-3, 1-5) has the week off from NCAC play to host Marietta on Saturday. The final game on the slate for the coming week is a home contest for Kenyon when non-conference foe Washington & Jefferson visits Gambier Sunday.

All six teams saw conference action last week. Ohio Wesleyan claimed first place as its own with a three-goal defeat of Kenyon. Denison moved into sole possession of second with a win over Wittenberg. The Tigers later defeated Oberlin to level its NCAC record at 1-1. Wooster also knocked off the Yeomen to join the three-way tie for third with the Lords and Wittenberg.

Denison's **Craig Pastor (Columbus, OH/Upper Arlington)** and **Jason Anderson (Denver, CO/East)** were both major contributors to their team's scoring last week. Each scored three goals in the Big Red victory over Wittenberg, then in the win over Greensboro, Pastor netted two goals and two assists, while Anderson added two goals and one assist. In all, 10 different players scored against the Tigers. Junior goalkeeper **Tom Moriarty (Buffalo, NY/Canisus)** allowed six goals and made 22 saves (.785 saves percentage) in 111 minutes of play ... Ohio Wesleyan senior **Andy Rowe (Alpharetta, GA/Penfield, NY)** scored six goals to lead the Bishops over Kenyon. He leads the NCAC with 3.50 goals per game. Lord goalkeeper **Dave Neiman (Glencoe, IL/New Trier)** made 19 saves in the contest. He shares the NCAC lead in saves percentage for the season with Denison's Moriarty (.615) ... Wittenberg won two of three games last week. Sophomore **Trevor Carlson (Upper Arlington, OH/Upper Arlington)** scored eight goals against Oberlin and added two goals and an assist against Marietta ... Wooster freshman midfielder **Eric McKinney (Cincinnati, OH/Summit Country Day)** scored a team-best four goals on six shots in a Scot victory over Oberlin.

**Poll:** In the latest STX/USILA poll (Mar. 31) Ohio Wesleyan ranked 14th, up one spot from the previous week.

**WOMEN'S LACROSSE REPORT**

Six conference games are slated for the coming week. Wooster (1-0, 4-1) travels to Ohio Wesleyan (1-1, 4-5) to open action on Tuesday. Wednesday features Denison's (0-0, 4-4) conference opener at Oberlin (0-2, 0-5) and Earlham (0-1, 1-2) at Wittenberg (1-1, 1-4). Friday afternoon, the Tigers travel to Granville for a match against the Big Red. The week wraps up with two NCAC contests on Saturday – the Bishops host Allegheny (1-1, 2-5) and the Quakers host Kenyon (2-0, 4-1).

Last week, Kenyon remained unbeaten with a 17-15 decision over Ohio Wesleyan. The NCAC's leading scorer **Melissa Blum (Chevy Chase, MD/St. Andrew's)** and conference goal-scoring leader **Kaley Bell (Pennington, NJ/Hopewell Valley Central)** each scored six times in the victory to lead the Ladies. Bell, who entered the week with eight goals in three games, exploded to score 12 times and added an assist in two Kenyon victories last week ... Senior **Amanda McDermott (Wayne, PA/Episcopal Academy)** led Ohio Wesleyan with four goals and two assists in the loss ... Wooster won its conference opener. The Scots defeated Oberlin behind freshman **Megan Sward (Sewickely, MA/Sewickley Academy)** who totaled three goals and one assist. In Wooster's 2-0 week, she recorded nine points on five goals and four assists ... Allegheny and Wittenberg each won last week after losing their openers the week before. The Gators defeated Earlham as junior **Joan Anderson (Holt, MI/Holt)** scored two goals and added three assists. Anderson recorded four goals and four assists in Allegheny's 1-1 week. The Tigers defeated Oberlin ... Denison competed in the Heron Draw at William Smith and dropped both of their contests. **Leslie Masterpaul (Cleveland Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)** led the team with two goals and one assist in the two games.

**SOFTBALL REPORT**

Wittenberg (4-0, 12-10) and Denison (2-0, 10-14) enter the third week of the NCAC schedule with undefeated league records. The Tigers have won two series, while the Big Red, conference champs the past two seasons, have won one. Each team puts their unblemished records on the line twice this week. On Tuesday, the Tigers travel to fifth-place Wooster (0-1-1, 9-12-1), while the Big Red host third-place Kenyon (3-1, 7-14). Both teams return to the field Saturday: Wittenberg hosts fifth-place Hiram (1-3, 5-15) while Denison hosts fourth-place Allegheny (2-1-1, 5-13-1). Last week, the Big Red Hiram, while the Tigers swept Ohio Wesleyan and Oberlin.

In other action on Tuesday, Hiram heads to Ohio Wesleyan (1-3, 10-13) Ohio Wesleyan visits Oberlin (0-4, 3-10). The last game slated for this week, sends Wooster to Ohio Wesleyan on Saturday. Last week, Allegheny defeated Wooster in the first game of their NCAC doubleheader. The two teams tied, 3-3 after 10 innings in the second game. It was the first tie for both programs. The Gators also split with Ohio Wesleyan. Kenyon and Hiram , also split their doubleheader last week.

Allegheny sophomore outfielder **Sarah Johnston (Renfrew, PA/Butler Area)** went 8-20 (.400) over eight games last week, scoring four runs and knocking in two. She had a game-tying RBI double with two outs in the bottom of the tenth against Wooster and scored the game-winning run in a 1-0 win over Grove City. Freshman **Giannina Cocco (Miami, FL/Palmetto)** was 2-0 in three starts, allowing just four earned runs and striking out 13 over 21.0 innings of work. She had a 1.33 ERA for the week as opponents hit just .215 off of her. She is 2-3 on the season with a 1.44 earned run average ... Denison freshman **Julie Marks (Columbus, OH/Worthington Kilbourn)** turned in the first four-hit day of her career thanks to a 4-4 effort against Hiram in game two of the doubleheader. Marks, a leffilder, scored four runs in that game and had one RBI. **Erin McClincy (Hilliard, OH/Darby)** started two games this week for the Big Red and did not allow an earned run over 16.0 innings. Against Hiram the junior limited the Terriers to seven hits and one run in seven innings pitched. For the season McClincy is 4-4 with a 1.28 ERA. Senior catcher **Lindsey Fischer (Gahanna, OH/Gahanna)** led Denison with a .562 average through five games last week. She was 9-16 with two doubles, two runs scored and one RBI. Fischer is second on the team with a .328 batting average ... Hiram sophomore shortstop **Monica Hayden (West Farmington, OH/Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin)** extended her hitting streak to seven games. During her run at the plate, she is hitting .381 (8-21) with three runs and five RBI. Sophomore outfielder **Jamie Hanson (Leslie, MI/Leslie)** was 4-12 (.333) in four games last week ... Kenyon's **Samantha Foy (Garrettsville, OH/Garfield)** pitched four of five games for the Ladies last week. In 22.0 innings of work, she allowed only six earned runs and struck out 13 batters. She went 1-2 on the week. Freshman **Jenny Glaeser (Houston, TX)** hit safely in all five Kenyon games last week. She was 8-14 (.571) with four RBI, four doubles and one stolen base ... Freshman **Tiffany Stinemetz (Marysville, OH/North Union)** went 7-13 (.538) with three doubles and four RBI for Ohio Wesleyan last week ... Wittenberg sophomore **Norah Gillam (Canfield, OH/Canfield)** hurled complete-game wins over Ohio Wesleyan and Oberlin. She allowed 11 hits and two earned runs in 14.0 innings and struck out 12 batters. Senior **Beth Walters (Westerville, OH/Columbus DeSales)** was 6-11 (.545) with five RBI and a home run against Ohio Wesleyan. She is batting .426 for the season ... Wooster junior **Brianne Diorio (Boardman, OH/Cardinal Mooney)** went 6-15 (.400) with two doubles, three steals, five runs scored, and two RBI last week, and now owns an eight-game hitting streak since the team returned from spring break. She got two hits and reached base via a hit by pitch in the Allegheny doubleheader, and then led Wooster in the sweep of CWRU with four hits, two steals, and three runs scored. Freshman pitcher **Trish Gordon (Litchfield, OH/Brunswick)** combined for 10.0 innings of one-run ball last week. She scattered just five hits over eight in the second game of the Allegheny doubleheader, striking out five and only allowing a run after the international tiebreaker was put into effect in the 10th inning. Gordon picked up the win in the first CWRU game after coming in during the sixth, and not allowing a hit.

**MEN'S TENNIS REPORT**

There is only one East division match slated for this week. Oberlin (1-0, 9-7) and Wooster (1-0, 5-5) two of the three teams tied for first in the East meet in Oberlin on Wednesday. Kenyon (1-0, 7-3), the third team tied for first, and fifth-place Hiram (0-3, 3-7) do not have divisional matches scheduled. Fourth-place Allegheny (1-1, 5-11) will play two crossover, non-conference matches this week, against Wittenberg and Earlham, both on Wittenberg's courts on Saturday.

The West division will see conference action twice this week. On Tuesday, Denison (2-0, 4-5) and Wittenberg (2-0, 8-4) will meet in a match to decide sole ownership of first place. The match will be played in Springfield. Wittenberg will also host Earlham (0-1, 14-1) on Saturday. The Quakers are one of three teams tied for third in the West. Earlham shares the spot with Wabash (0-1, 2-9) and Ohio Wesleyan (0-2, 6-6).

Six of 10 NCAC squads will compete at the Great Lakes Colleges Association tournament on Friday and Saturday. Denison, Kenyon, Oberlin, Ohio Wesleyan, Wabash and Wooster are all making the trip to Hope. Kenyon led all NCAC teams with a second-place finish at last spring's event.

Last week, Oberlin topped Wabash in non-conference play. The Yeomen took all of the singles points, while the Little Giants took the doubles point with wins by the team of sophomore **Nathan Cain (Columbus, IN/Columbus North)** and junior **Cameron Starnes (Crawfordsville, IN/Crawfordsville)** at number two doubles and sophomore **Paul Drambarean (Attica, IN/Attica)** and freshman **Aaron Miller (Kokomo, IN/Kokomo)** at number three doubles. Earlham sophomore **Chuck DiLalla (Cleveland Hts., OH/Cleveland Hts.)** leads the NCAC at number two singles, with a 13-3 overall record. He is also part of the league's top number one doubles team, along with partner **Adam Turner (Richmond, IN/Richmond)**, a senior. The pair have a 13-4 overall record.

**WOMEN'S TENNIS REPORT**

There will be a North Coast tennis team in action almost every day this week. Kenyon (0-0, 5-4) opens league play today, when the Ladies host Ohio Wesleyan (2-2, 4-5). Tomorrow, Denison (2-0, 5-1), one of three teams without a single conference loss, travels to Wittenberg (1-0, 4-7). The Tigers do not have an NCAC loss, having won their only league match to date. On Wednesday, Wooster (0-2, 0-8) travels to Oberlin (2-0, 11-6). The Fighting Scots are looking for their first win of the season, while the Yeowomen look to extend their two-match conference winning streak. On Thursday, The Bishops are on the road again, this time at Wittenberg. Conference action concludes on Saturday with four matches. Allegheny (1-1, 6-8) is at Wooster while Earlham (1-1, 8-4) and Oberlin are at Wittenberg for a tri-match.

In non-conference play, Denison, Kenyon and Oberlin are scheduled to compete at the Midwest Regional on Friday and Saturday in Madison, Wi. The Ladies placed third at last spring's tournament. The Yeowomen placed 11th.

Last week at the GLCA tournament, Denison and Ohio Wesleyan topped Wooster. The tournament was played indoors to best of five, rather than best of nine, due to poor weather conditions.

**TRACK & FIELD REPORT**

This week, Allegheny and Hiram run at the Mount Union Invitational, Denison, Kenyon, Oberlin and Wooster join Ohio Wesleyan at OWU's Marv Frye Invitational. Earlham and Wabash compete at the Indiana Intercollegiate Championships at Indiana Wesleyan, and Wittenberg hosts the Twilight Invitational.

Last week, Allegheny's **Dan Princic (Carrolton, OH/Carrolton)** broke his own school mark in the 5,000 meters (14:48.23) to place second at the Duke Invitational. His time was a provisional qualifying clocking. On the women's side, **Leah Shouey (Franklin, PA/Franklin Area)** met the NCAA provisional standard in the 1500 meters (4:41.78), which was good for 19th place ... Denison's men were 12th at the Wilmington Invitational, and the women were second. **Laura Finkes (Hebron, OH/Lakewood)** led the women with first-place finishes in both the discus and the shot put. The top individual finisher for the men was **Zach Joyes (Stoughton, WI/Stoughton)** who was seventh in the 400 meter hurdles ... Hiram and Oberlin ran at the Case Western Reserve Invitational. Oberlin's women were second and Hiram's placed fourth in the five-team event. The Terrier men were fourth and the Yeomen were fifth in the men's competition. Hiram senior **Jenny Wilke (Sandusky, OH/Sandusky)** won the women's 10K (35:54.00) and senior **Emma Brown (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** took first in the women's long jump (16-2 1/2). Leading Oberlin's women were individual winners **Lori Tuchfeld (N. Merrick, N.Y./Sanford H. Calhoun)** in the 800 (2:31.17) and 1500 (5:03.41), **Kyle McKenzie (Milton, NH)** in the 5K (18:48.90) and **Shannon Houlihan (Gorham, ME)** in the 100 hurdles (16.61) and triple jump (10.19 meters/33 feet, 5 1/4 inches). **Bret Peterson (Greenville, MI)** won the men's 400 meters (50.06) to lead the Yeomen ... Kenyon and Wooster ran at the Bud Yoeast Invitational at Otterbein. The Wooster men were third and Kenyon's were fourth in the four-team event. The Ladies placed third and the Scot women were fourth. Individual winners for Kenyon were **P.J Busted (Jamestown, NY/Jamestown)** in the 800 (2:03.24), **Sean Strader (Clayton, OH/Northmont)** in the 1500 (4:24.71) and **Ben Hildebrand (Fairport, NY/The Harley School)** in the steeplechase (9:42.03). In the women's meet, **Heather McMillan (Glencoe, IL/New Trier)** won the 1500 (5:09.84), **Jocelyn Anthony (Jamestown, RI/St. George's)** took the steeplechase (12:56.05) and **Katie Walker (Columbus, OH/Academy)** placed first in the long jump (17-1 3/4) for the Ladies. For Wooster, **Jill Berner (Fredonia, NY/Fredonia)** won the pole vault (9-6), **Nicole DeSantis (Gates Mills, OH/Mayfield)** won the 800 meters (2:28.87) and **Barbara Patrick (Ann Arbor, MI/Pioneer)** won the 5K (19:21.18) ... Ohio Wesleyan and Wittenberg competed in the Wittenberg Challenge multi-event meet. Leading the Bishop women was junior **Fay Barry (Reynoldsburg, OH/Reynoldsburg)** who won the shot put (35-2) and the discus (124-2). Junior **Tim Gaal (Amanda, OH/Clearcreek)** placed second in the decathlon, but beat all of the collegiate competitors ... Wabash placed fourth of five teams at the Manchester Invitational. **Adam Futscher (Cincinnati, OH/Sycamore)** won the javelin (50.68 meters/166 feet, 3inches) and **Caleb Ishman (Gary IN/Emerson Visual and Performing Arts)** won the hammer with a throw of 39.02 meters (128 feet even).

## NCAC ATHLETES OF THE WEEK (Apr. 7)

### BASEBALL (PLAYER/PITCHER)

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Wooster junior **Matt Miller (Millersburg, OH/Hiland)** went 9-17 (.529) last week, including four doubles and a homer, and scored four runs while driving in eight others. Highlighting his week, Miller hit a two-out, two-run double in the bottom of the ninth to give Wooster a 5-4 win over NCAA Division I Kent State. It was his second double of the game. Miller also hit a key home run against Mt. Vernon Nazarene, which tied the game 8-8 after Wooster had fallen behind (8-3), and added a 3-7 (.429), four-RBI performance in the doubleheader sweep of Wittenberg. **PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Oberlin junior **Troy DeWitt (San Diego, CA/Bishop's School)** picked up a win and two saves for Oberlin last week. In game one of the NCAC series against Kenyon, he threw a three-hit, complete-game shutout against Kenyon, fanning nine. He returned to the mound for a save in game three of the series.
