**NCAC Football Report**  
**NORTH COAST CONFERENCE ACTION KICKS OFF;**  
**NCAC TEAMS FIND SUCCESS OUTSIDE CONFERENCE**

**CLEVELAND** -- Eight North Coast teams take the field in six non-conference games this week. Ohio Wesleyan and Wabash, each coming off dramatic wins last week, kick things off by facing NCAC teams. The Bishops (1-0), who topped Olivet, 25-21, return home to host Denison (0-2). The Little Giants (1-0), 27-20 come-from-behind winners over Kalamazoo, travel to Earlham (0-2). This will be the first non-conference matchups between NCAC teams since 1999, when Oberlin played a non-conference schedule which included several conference schools. Wooster (1-0) and Oberlin (0-1), idle last week, return to action on Saturday. The Fighting Scots host Bethany; The Yeomen travel to Case Western Reserve. Hiram (0-2) plays at Mt. St. Joseph.

This week, both Allegheny (1-1) and Wittenberg (2-0) take a rest. The Gators in particular deserve a break after pulling off a stunning 28-25 upset over highly respected Washington & Jefferson. Senior cornerback **Derek Vikara (Pittsburgh, PA/Plum)** paced the Allegheny defense which forced eight turnovers - and provided the offensive spark which handed the game to the Gators. Vikara turned a fourth-quarter interception into an 87-yard touchdown, earning Allegheny a lead which they would never relinquish. The win, the Gator's first over W & J since 1981, was also the first for new skipper **Mark Matlak**. The Tigers defeated Urbana, 37-10, before an estimated crowd of more than 2,100 at Urbana High School. Wittenberg relied on senior tailback **Daniel Grove (Uhrichsville, OH/Claymont)**, who tied a school record with his sixth straight 100-yard rushing performance. Grove totaled 166 yards and three touchdowns on 21 carries. The Tigers return to action at Thomas More on Sept. 28; Allegheny travels to Westminster the same day.

**PLAYERS OF THE WEEK**

CLEVELAND -- Wabash junior **Chris Morris (Zionsville, IN/Zionsville)** and Ohio Wesleyan freshman **Ryan McCarty (Grove City, OH/Bishop Ready)** have been named offensive and defensive "Players of the Week" for their performances last week in the North Coast Athletic Conference.

**Morris**, a 5-10, 200-pound running back, rushed for 133 yards and one touchdown on 25 carries. Morris helped propel the Little Giants to a come-from-behind 28-21 win over Kalamzoo. Wabash never led until the final 30 seconds of the game.

**McCarty**, a 5-10, 155-pound safety, sealed the Battling Bishops 25-21 win over Olivet by picking off a Comet pass in the Ohio Wesleyan end zone with five seconds left on the clock. He totalled two interceptions and broke up three others while also recovering two fumbles. McCarty registered five tackles against Olivet.

#### GRID NOTEBOOK

**Defense is the Best Offense:** NCAC defensive players turned in some very offensive performances last week. Allegheny's **Derek Vikara** returned an interception 87 yards, giving the Gators the lead over W & J. Earlham senior defensive back **Saul Mack (Ft. Wayne, IN/Snyder)** recovered a Manchester fumble and scampered 77 yards to score the Quakers first TD of the season. Kenyon's **Alexi Whitney (New Canaan, CT/New Canaan)**, a freshman defensive back, had a 59-yard interception return that set up the Lords' only touchdown against Bethany. While Ohio Wesleyan's **Ryan McCarty's** last-minute interception in the OWU endzone preserved the Bishops win over Olivet, he also set up OWU's game-winning drive with a fumble recovery with 2:16 left to play. Wittenberg senior safety **Andy Waddle (Enon, OH/Greenon)** took an interception 52 yards to the Urbana one-yard line as the clock expired for the third quarter. On the first play of the fourth, Wittenberg crossed the goal line for six points and a 27-10 score.

Denison junior punter **Andy Stromwell (Waukesha, WI/Waukesha South)** had a busy day, punting eight times and placing the Spartans in their own 20-yard line four times. He averaged 38 yards per punt and booted one 54 yards in the second quarter ... Wabash rallied to score 27 points in the last 18 minutes of its game against Kalamazoo which was delayed twice due to lighting - once for one hour and six minutes and again for one hour and four minutes.

### NCAC Fall Sports Update

**MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SOCCER, VOLLEYBALL BEGIN NCAC PLAY;  
NATIONALLY-RANKED WITTENBERG FIELD HOCKEY OFF TO 6-0 START**

**CLEVELAND** -- Following is a capsule roundup of the NCAC's fall sports action.

### CROSS COUNTRY REPORT

Seven NCAC schools participated in the 2002 GLCA Cross Country meet, held at Kenyon last weekend. Denison won the women's race, with Oberlin close behind in a tie for second. Kenyon was fourth and Wooster wound up fifth. Kenyon was runner-up in the men's competition, followed by Denison in fourth and Wooster in fifth.

Denison senior **Brock Babcock (Platte City, MO/Platte County)** placed second in the field of 93 runners with a time of 26:58 over the five-mile course. Three Kenyon runners were also in the top 10: Senior **Ben Hildebrand (Fairport, NY/The Harley School)**, senior **Michael Baird (Temple, TX/Temple)** and junior **Andrew Sisson (Granville, OH/Granville)** in places seven through nine. Hildebrand finished in 27:37, Baird crossed the line in 28:08 and Sisson was clocked at 28:11. In the women's race, Oberlin senior **Laura Feeney (Stattsburgh, NY/Franklin D. Roosevelt)** led a group of seven runners from NCAC schools in the top 10. She was runner up with a 29:09 clocking, with freshman **Christina McNamara (Chappaqua, NY/Horace Greeley)** of Kenyon (20:11), freshman **Kim Murley (Dalton, PA/Tunkhannock Area)** of Denison (20:12) and sophomore **Jennifer Stockdale (Rocky River, OH/St. Joseph Academy)** of Wooster (20:19) rounding out the top five. In places seven through nine were Oberlin junior **Julia Goeke (St. Louis, MO/Nerinx Hall)** in 20:22, Kenyon junior **Tenaya Britton (Bethesda, MD/Walter Johnson)** with a time of 20:27 and Denison senior **Adrienne Shue (Circleville, OH/Circleville)** crossing in 20:33.

Wittenberg was the only NCAA Division III participating in the Cedarville Friendship Invitational. The men's team placed sixth of eight teams while the women were sixth of six. The top individual for the men was senior **Nick DeWald (Mansfield, OH/Senior)** in 29<sup>th</sup> place with a 28:04.82 clocking. Leading the women was senior **Abi Gerstle (Kettering, OH/Fairmont)** who was ninth in 19:21.29.

Allegheny and Hiram were both idle last weekend. In the coming week, Allegheny hosts the Allegheny Classic on Saturday. Hiram will also participate in that meet. The Denison and Ohio Wesleyan squads compete in the Wilmington Invitational that day. Earlham and Wabash are both slated to participate in the Indiana Intercollegiate on Friday night. Kenyon will travel to Wisconsin-Parkside to compete in the Midwest Collegiate Championships on Saturday. Oberlin will be in New York City the same day to run in the NYU Invitational, which will take place at Van Cortlandt Park in the Bronx. Wittenberg and Wooster are both idle until the Sept. 28.

### FIELD HOCKEY REPORT

Defending North Coast champion Wooster (1-0, 2-1) has started the 2002 season on a perfect note, winning its first early conference game, a 5-0 defeat of Ohio Wesleyan. This week the Fighting Scots look for NCAC wins number two, three and four in their quest to repeat, as they host Earlham (1-1, 3-2) today, travel to Kenyon (0-2, 1-2) on Thursday and return home to face Denison (0-1, 3-3) on Saturday. Currently, Wooster is tied for first with Wittenberg and Oberlin. The Tigers (2-0, 6-0), ranked 13th in the first NFHC poll of the season (Sept. 10), bested Earlham and Denison last week, 3-0, and 4-0, respectively. Wittenberg is the first team from the Great Lakes Region to be ranked in the national coaches poll since 1999. Wittenberg plays only once this week, travelling to Oberlin on Saturday. The Yeowomen (1-0, 1-0), who defeated Kenyon, will take the field twice this week - they also travel to Denison on Tuesday before their meeting with the Tigers. In other conference action, Ohio Wesleyan (0-1, 2-3) heads west to Earlham on Wednesday and returns home to host Kenyon on Saturday.

**Notes:** Earlham junior midfielder **Rebecca Aldred (Glen Mills, PA/West Nottingham)** totalled two goals and an assist against Hanover and Bellarmine, earning MVP honors at the regional tournament at Bellarmine. Aldred has led the Quakers to one of their best starts ever. Earlham has won three straight games and owns the schools' winningest record ... Denison sophomore **Karen Lancaster (Hurst, TX/L.D. Bell)** leads the Big Red in points (five) ... Ohio Wesleyan's **Ann Capute (Easton, MD/**

**Easton**), a sophomore forward, scored the deciding goal in the Bishop's 5-0 win over Washington & Jefferson. She also added an assist ... Wooster senior **Lindsay Boardman (Hampton, CT/Pomfret Prep)** tallied a pair of goals in the Scots' lone game last week, a 5-0 win over Ohio Wesleyan.

**MEN'S SOCCER REPORT**

The 2002 North Coast season kicks off with three games this week, all on Saturday. Defending NCAC champion Ohio Wesleyan (7-0) travels to Wabash (4-2), while last fall's runner-up, Denison (3-3), also opens its league schedule on the road. The Big Red head west to Earlham (1-3-1). The final game pits Wooster (6-0-1) against Allegheny (4-1) in Meadville.

Ohio Wesleyan is off to its usual fast start. Last week, the Bishops, ranked first in the Great Lakes Region and fourth nationally by the NSCAA, defeated Wilmington 3-2, then beat DePauw, 2-1. The Bishops have won seven straight games to start the season undefeated. Freshman midfielder **Jeff Fisher (Westerville, OH/Westerville North)** netted two goals against regionally ranked Wilmington ... Wabash freshman forward **Chase Lamm (Brownsburg, IN/Brownsburg)** scored two goals and added an assist in a 5-1 win over Anderson. He has five goals, three assists for 13 points on the season ... **Chad Huber (Fairfield, OH/Fairfield)**, a sophomore midfielder, found the back of the net twice as Denison split a pair of games last week ... Allegheny's **Adam Fletcher (LaVale, MD/Fort Hill)**, a senior forward, scored the Gators' only goal in a 3-1 loss to Fredonia. The Gators are ranked seventh in the Great Lakes Region.

**WOMEN'S SOCCER REPORT**

The first three matches of the 2002 conference campaign will take place on Saturday. The first match features the league's only undefeated teams. Defending North Coast champion Ohio Wesleyan (6-0) welcomes Wooster (5-0-2) to Delaware. Allegheny (5-2) travels to Earlham (0-6) and Wittenberg (1-5) heads to Hiram (3-2-1).

Five NCAC teams are ranked among the best in the Great Lakes Region, paced by Ohio Wesleyan in first. Denison ranks third and Allegheny, Kenyon and Wooster are all tied for ninth. Ohio Wesleyan tops the NSCAA National poll; Denison ranks 18th ... The Big Red's **Colleen Wirtz (Westerville, OH/St. Francis de Sales)**, a freshman midfielder, recorded her second game-winner of the season, lifting the Big Red past regionally ranked (seventh) Wilmington, 2-1. Wirtz leads Denison with 1.16 points per game (three goals, one assist in six games) ... Kenyon sophomore midfielder **Heather Preston (Berea, OH)** scored her fourth goal of the season, the game-winner against Baldwin-Wallace ... Ohio Wesleyan freshman midfielder **Sarah Wall (Columbus, OH/Upper Arlington)** opened the scoring in the Bishops' 2-1 overtime win over 10th-ranked DePauw ... Wooster senior keeper **Nicole Roman (Akron, OH/Archbishop Hoban)** played every minute of the Scots' two games last week, making six saves.

**VOLLEYBALL REPORT**

The North Coast Athletic Conference volleyball season gets under way on Saturday with three tri-matches on the slate. Five-time defending champion Wittenberg (0-0, 9-3) opens the 2002 campaign by hosting Kenyon (0-0, 6-8) and Allegheny (0-0, 4-10). Denison (0-0, 7-3), last year's runner up, also opens at home when the Big Red plays host to Oberlin (0-0, 1-10) and Earlham (0-0, 0-14). Wooster (0-0, 8-6) hosts the other tri-match when Ohio Wesleyan (0-0, 0-10) and Hiram (0-0, 7-6) travel to the Scots' home court. Every team but Hiram will play one non-conference match during the week as a final tune up for the conference season begins.

Four NCAC squads enter the conference season with winning records – Wittenberg, Denison, Wooster and Hiram ... Wittenberg competed in the Washington (Mo.) Tournament, and placed second. The 11th-ranked Tigers picked up victories over 10th ranked Central, 14th ranked Puget Sound and 16th ranked Ohio Northern in the tourney. The team's lone loss came to the tournament champion Bears, who are ranked fourth in the nation in Division III. Sophomore setter **Sarah Yuskewich (Columbus, OH/Watterson)** was named to the all-tournament team. It was the third consecutive week in which she was named to an all-tourney squad. Yuskewich recorded 68 assists in the victory over the Polar Bears ... Denison placed second in the John Carroll/Case Western Reserve Volleyball Tournament. The Big Red picked up wins over Kenyon, Grove City and Case Western Reserve before falling to champion Baldwin-Wallace. Senior **Becky Turk (Middleburg Hts., OH/Midpark)** recorded 51 kills in 12 games. The Ladies placed fourth in the same event. Senior **Cori Arnold (West Lafayette, OH/Ridgewood)** had a combined 36 kills, four service aces, 28 digs and 11 blocks in Kenyon's two wins last week ... Wooster went 2-2 last week with four-game victories over St. Mary's of Indiana and Oberlin and losses to Heidelberg and Defiance ... Hiram went 3-1 at the Penn State-Behrend tournament. The Terriers defeated Pitt-Greensburg, Behrend and Wilmington and lost to Fredonia St. Junior middle hitter **Bobbi Wymer (Ravenna, OH/Ravenna)** was named to the all-tournament team ... Allegheny had a rough week at the Otterbein Cardinal Classic, dropping all four of its matches. Junior setter **Vicki Kajder (Trafford, PA/Penn-Trafford)** recorded 150 assists, 39 digs and 28 kills in five games last week. She ranks second on the team in kills. Earlham also dropped all its matches at the Otterbein tourney. Sophomore **Jerilyn Grote (Delphos, OH/St. John)** had 12 kills and three blocks in the match with Capital. Oberlin lost non-conference matches to Ursuline and Defiance last week ... Ohio Wesleyan lost to nationally ranked Ohio Northern in the Bishops' only action.
